



Morven Recycling

The Morven recycling drop-off point has now been established.

The colour coded bins are positioned along the western wall of the **Morven Hall**, at the intersection of Barnetts Rd and Maclean St.

This additional Council service provides for the bins to be emptied weekly or fortnightly depending on the need.

Items other than the accepted recyclables shown will not be accepted or collected.

Please ensure **clean** recyclables are deposited into the correct bins.

What you CAN Recycle

Aluminium Cans

Just rinse out the can.

Paper

Newspapers and small numbers of glossy magazines and circulars are acceptable.

Flattened Corrugated Cardboard

Please flatten the cardboard out so more can fit in the bin.

Glass Bottles & Jars

all colours accepted (place in correct bin)

Broken or whole glass bottles and jars only. Rinse out and remove any tops or caps. No household, window glass, pyrex or drinking glasses allowed.

Plastics

Wash out bottles and remove tops, which can go loose into the bin. This includes all grades of plastic containers. Larger plastic items can be taken to the RRP at the end of Racecourse Rd, Waimate.

Tin Cans

Wash out the can, push lids inside and squeeze top together.

Hint: It's much easier if you wash food tins out straight away.

But we CAN'T Recycle

Food or other organics

We can't recycle food or food contaminated waste yet. Food and greenwaste must either be composted on your property or greenwaste can be taken to the RRP at the end of Racecourse Rd, Waimate - a charge will apply.

Other Glass

No household, window glass or glass connected to other material

e.g. light bulbs, mirrors

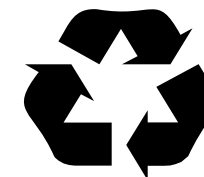
WAIMATE RESOURCE RECOVERY PARK OPEN HOURS
