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POTABLE WATER SUPPLY

CUSTOMER INFORMATION

The following are guidance notes for assessing compliance and subject to ongoing review, and may not cover every requirement. They are offered on a “no liability” basis.

PROCEDURES WHERE THERE IS NO PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY AVAILABLE

1. Quality of Water

The quality of water supplied shall meet the guideline values and requirements set down in the publication. Drinking water standards for New Zealand prepared for the Department of Health

2. Source of Supply

Prior to sinking a well, Resource Consents may be needed to be obtained from ECAN (Canterbury Regional Council)

Where an alternative source of supply is proposed, the details of the source (water tanks etc) should be supplied with Building Consent.

A copy of the Certificate of Analysis should be provided with each Building Consent application relying on well water supply.

3. Advised on PIM

There is no public water supply to serve this building, a Certificate of Analysis for potable water is required. This certificate must be submitted to Building Control before the building is occupied and Code Compliance Certificate is issued.

4. Consent Conditions

A Certificate for Potable Water must be provided to Building Control before the building is allowed to be occupied and Code Compliance Certificate issued.
