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What Do We Do Now?

There are eight Cemeteries in the Waimate District. Those in the Hakataramea area, Esk Valley and Waihao Downs are run by local community boards. Two are closed for interments at Glenavy, 0.3462ha and Morven, 0.814ha Cemeteries, but are maintained by the District Council. There are two Maori Cemeteries at Te Huru Huru Road near Waimate and the other at Waihao Marae. The two active Council Cemeteries are in Otaio on 0.3495 ha and Waimate on 4.514 ha.

Cemeteries are mapped and burial records maintained to assist relatives and genealogical research for the Council Cemeteries and will be extended to the other Cemeteries within the District.

Average interments per year are 55.

Tasks.

Tasks are the routine matters that Council will attend to every year, in order to maintain service levels set in agreement with our community.

- Provide interment facilities to serve the needs of our community.
- Maintain the Waimate Cemeteries to agreed service levels.
- Provide Cemeteries that cater for differing burial requirements based on



religious association and service in the Armed Forces.

- Mow Otaio, Glenavy and Morven Cemeteries.

Why Do We Do It?

Local Authorities are required through the Burial and Cremation Act 1964 to provide cemeteries for their communities.

To provide an interment facility to service the needs of the community.

Our Service Levels

Open to the public 7 days a week.

To maintain and upgrade to contract specifications.

A private contractor carries out maintenance at \$36,000 per year.

Other costs including Labour are estimated at \$4,500.

Outcomes Supported By This Activity

This activity supports the following Community Outcomes as described in the second volume of this plan.

- The health needs of the District are adequately provided for.
- The diverse spiritual needs of citizens are recognised and supported.
- The historical and cultural heritage of all citizens is adequately protected.

How Do We Get There?

The Council will play its part in achieving the above outcomes by continuing to conduct the relevant tasks that we do now and by extending into new projects as agreed with the community.

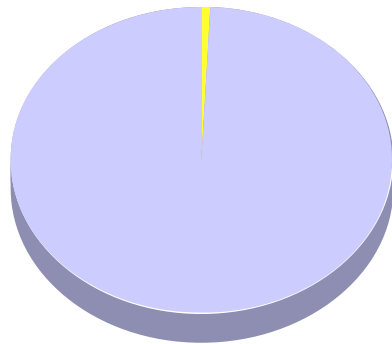
Projects

- Provide public access to a cemetery record database through the Council's Information Centre. Consultation required - Still requires public Consultation.

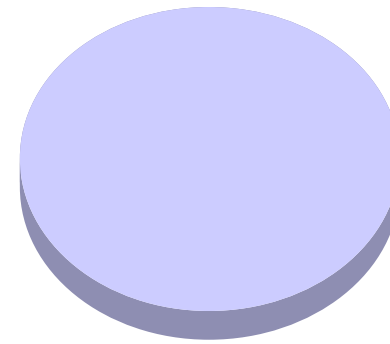
Waimate 2020
