All sowing and pricking out of annual plants for the spring display has been completed. All polyanthus have been bagged into bags.

The show-house display has been very colourful, with begonia, streptocarpus and fuchsia flowering at their best.

Some of the exotic trees have been pruned and had dead branches removed.

Dead-heading of rose bushes, spraying and fertilising has been carried out.

A new edition has arrived (baby fawn) in the zoo enclosure, both mother and baby are doing well.

All reserves have had a general clean-up with shrubs being trimmed, weed spraying carried out, plus the main street garden plots weeded and hoed.

General Reserves

All other rural reserves have been topped for long grass.

Centrewood

Weed spraying, mowing and repairs to the rock wall have been carried out.

The white horse memorial has recently been painted by community workers which had graffiti done on it over the new year period.
