



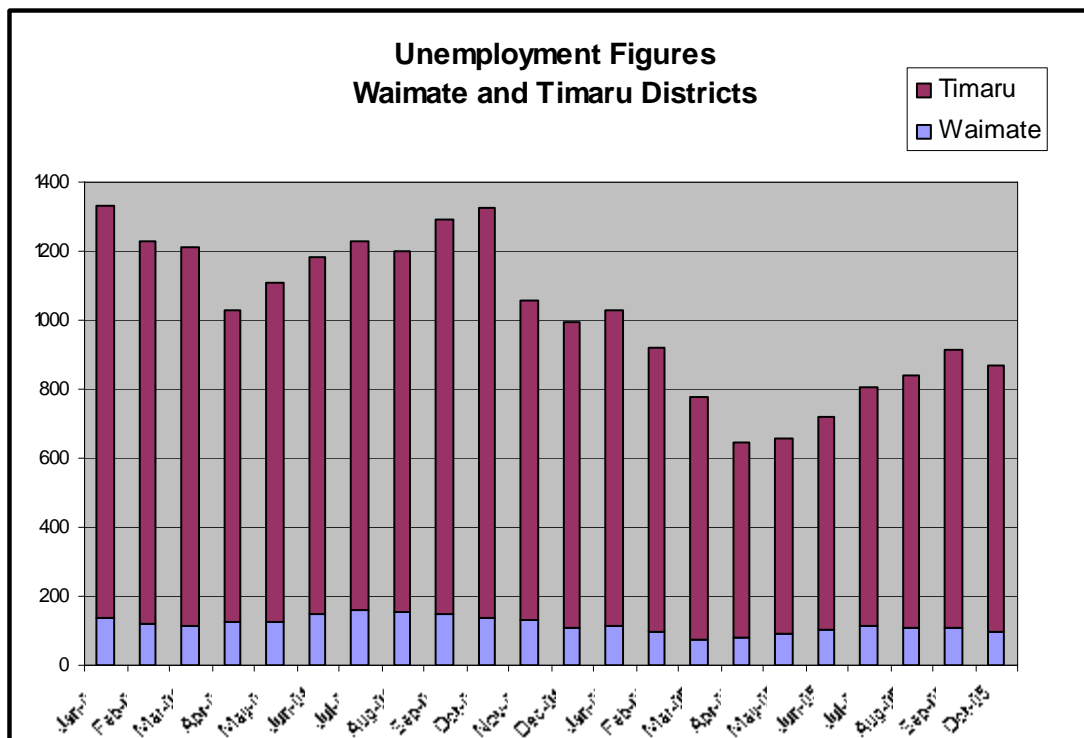

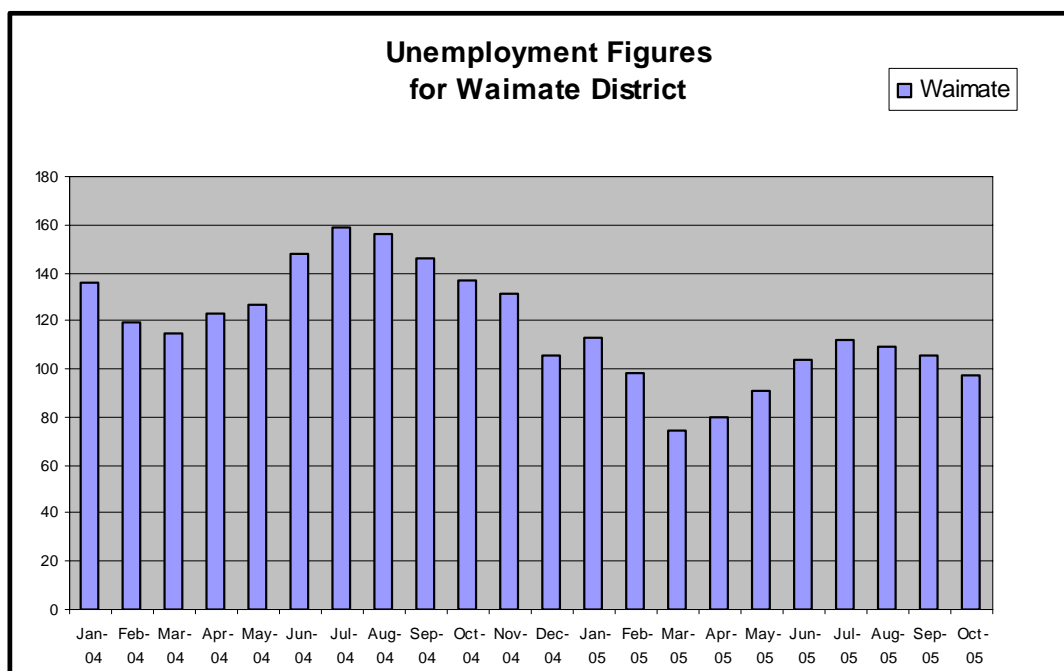
Resource Consents Granted

Glenavy Street Address Audit

Council's GIS officer has met with members of the Glenavy Fire Brigade and conducted an audit of street numbers in Glenavy identifying unactivated street numbers, unofficial numbers, missing and poorly visible numbers.

Processes to correct the above matters are now being undertaken.

Dog Registration

The number of dogs registered at 31 October 2005 was 2,964. Current number of known unregistered dogs is 32. Infringements have been issued for 16 dog owners.

Health

Infectious diseases have dropped to a more satisfactory level, with 4 campylobacter and 3 cryptosporidiosis reported. These were investigated and a report sent to Crown Public Health.

Civil Defence Co-ordinator

The main activities for the last month have been:

- Meetings with operations teams at Sector Posts creating communication plans to pass out warnings and identifying more Wardens.
- Radios and aerials have been placed at the Sector Posts at Cattle Creek, Hakataramea, Waihaorunga, Waihao Downs, Glenavy, Morven, and Willowbridge. The rest are still underway (slight delay due to Engineers illness).

- An Education plan has started in the schools, teaching basic civil defence readiness and setting the homework assignment of preparing a Survival Pack. The goal is to increase the personal readiness supplies held across the District.
- The annual South Island Civil Defence Officers Conference was held at Tekapo and was attended by two staff. A lot of valuable information was learnt and there was naturally a large bias towards Pandemic Planning.
- Over the next month further school visits are planned, aerial installation should be completed, more meetings are booked with Sector Post teams and Lynda Ramsay will be holding a Welfare Day and training at the A & P show. This will be backed up with an Operations display.
