Other areas, such as Otago and Southland, were also quick to follow suit, therefore it's clear a good number of Councils want time to consult with their communitities and make the right decision on what is easily the largest shake-up in the local government sector for some three decades.

In the meantime, we're all hoping to get back to alert level 2 soon to allow the opening day of the Waimate Lakes camping season to take place. As you will read below, season tickets are now available and have already proven to be in hot demand.
